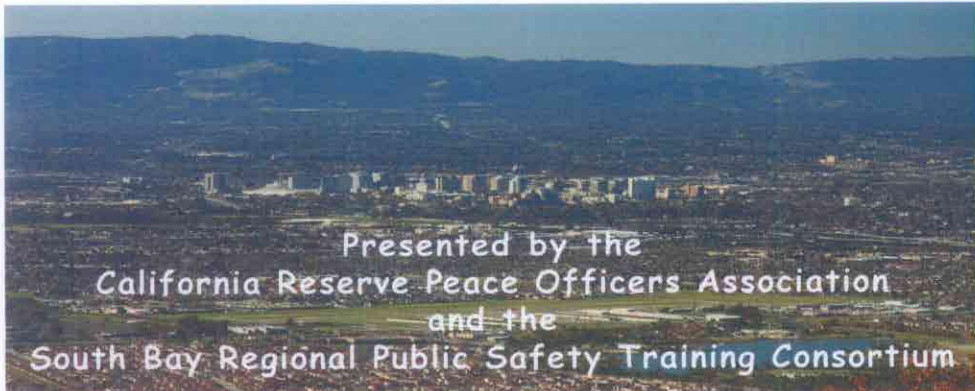

## Step 1 Complete the Conference Registration Form - [Form 1]

- ▶ Please print all information.
- ▶ While we encourage all attendees to support the CRPOA through membership, you do not need to be a member to attend.
- ▶ Many officers combine Conference attendance with a family vacation. Hotel and Conference space is limited. Hotel registration must be made directly with the hotel and not through ARPOC 2011 or CRPOA. We recommend that you complete your hotel registration at the same time you complete the Conference Registration.
- ▶ The conference fee is payable by check, money order, Visa or MasterCard. **Payment must accompany registration unless special arrangements have been made in advance with the CRPOA Finance Office.**
- ▶ Registration for the full conference includes 3 continental breakfasts and 3 lunches.
- ▶ On-site registration will be permitted, but classes will be limited to space available. No preregistration for classes will be taken at the Conference.

**Class Descriptions**



**John Wilson**

**ARIDE (Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement)**

This course will train law enforcement officers to observe, identify, and articulate the signs of impairment related to drugs, alcohol, or combination of both, in order to reduce the number of impaired driving incidents and crashes which result in serious injuries and fatalities. Many law enforcement officers are trained in Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST) and use the skills gained in the course as part of their overall enforcement of driving while impaired (DWI) laws. Additionally, some officers complete more advanced training through the Drug Evaluation and Classification (DEC) program and become Drug Recognition Experts (DRE). This course is not designed as a substitute to the DRE program and will not qualify or certify an individual as a DRE. This course is intended to bridge the gap between the SFST and DRE courses and to provide a level of awareness to the participants, both law enforcement and other criminal justice professionals, in the area of drug impairment in the context of traffic safety



**TERRORISM LIAISON OFFICER** Rick Lack & Randy Cook, Ret FBI



This course is designed to educate the basic entry level Terrorism Liaison Officer with the policies and procedures of the Fusion Center which they will be working with in their Area of Responsibility. The course will instruct the students: How the Fusion Center receives and distributes intelligence, the TLO's Responsibilities and Fusion Center Expectations, the lawful procedures in how intelligence is collected, used and stored. Intelligence procedures on the international, federal, and local arenas, Region specific international terrorism trends and indicators, and region specific domestic terrorism trends and indicators.



**Combat Grappling**

**Combat Grappling** is an introductory course that focuses on the progression of a ground fight from the initial takedown, maintaining control in all positions on the ground, to getting back to your feet. This is a dynamic course and will require a basic level of physical fitness. The course will incorporate instruction and drills in the following techniques: sprawls and scrambles, guard, standing from guard and gun retentions from the guard, mount escapes, guard escapes, side control and attacks, side control escapes, maintaining mount and transitions to handcuffing, breaking down an attacker's base controlling from the back to handcuffing, and finally back defense from chokes and escapes. All aspects of this course stress the importance of mindset and utilizing the appropriate force option.

**Low Light Night Shoot** with Brenda Nolen

You will gain confidence to take the SHOT, even in reduced lighting situations while remaining safe. The class will return to basics on using night sights and improve your gun handling skills while using a flashlight. You will learn techniques on how you can safely utilize your flashlight during reloading, searching, and movement scenarios. The class will review night vision, after-glow, and back lighting and provide you with a new level of confidence that normal light shooting cannot provide.

**Carrying Concealed Weapons**

This course presents the 'ins and outs' of carrying a concealed handgun while off-duty and the privileges, responsibilities and liability of doing so, discussion of LEOSA and CCW licenses for active and retired peace officers, methods of carry and remaining anonymous while carrying.

**Deadly Weapons Laws in California**



**Carl Miller**

This course is designed to inform the student officers of weapon law changes and give a general review of California Weapon Laws. The class makes use of an extensive course outline for instruction and a workbook of current California weapon laws with appropriate highlights. In addition there is a large selection of confiscated deadly weapons as teaching aids, in identification of weapons and proper ID of the applicable laws.



**Community, Communications and Compassion**

This four hour block will discuss how reserve officers communicate with community members. How community groups (stakeholders) need to be identified and their concerns addressed. Different ideas on how reserve officers need to deal with critical events by speaking with other officers and the importance of the Peer Support Team. Why compassion is necessary in real life events where reserve officers have effectively bonded with their community, department and their families.

**Penal and Vehicle Code Update-** The latest statutory changes and case law decisions. Enforcement tactics, statutory changes enacted in the last legislative session. This course also brings you the latest court cases that impact law enforcement.

**Drug Labs for the First Responder**

Taught by DOJ, this fast-paced four hour course, you'll learn many recognition techniques as a first responder regarding Mexican National manufacturing and trafficking trends, the extremely dangerous One-Pot process, the emerging Magnesium Process, the resurgence of PCP, how to recognize "smurfing organizations" and the explosion of Butane Honey Oil extraction labs.

**Gang Threats/Strategies**

This course is directed from a regional point of view to assist law enforcement personnel in the identification and investigative techniques involved in gang activity, suppression and prosecution. Topics will include: identification of primary street and prison gangs, gang profiles, signs of gang affiliation and street related gang activities, regional street and prison gang crimes, meanings of gang and other prison tattoos, and the components & certification process of the "Step Act": California Penal Code 186.22.

## Risk Management Considerations in Law Enforcement Operations Tactical Report Writing & Courtroom Testimony

## Class Descriptions

**Gordon Graham**

"Tactical Report Writing" focuses on the common errors and omissions public safety personnel make in incident documentation. These mistakes are not only embarrassing, but can also be very costly in terms of civil liability. The block of instruction on "Courtroom Testimony" is designed to give either the veteran or novice additional information on how to improve performance in this critical task.

### *Express Interrogation* by John Wilson

This is an informal clandestine process conducted after an arrest, a lawful detention, or consensual encounter. Most public safety professionals conducting law enforcement activities on a day-to-day basis in the field environment are not able to conduct recorded formal interviews. The interrogation process may take place minutes, hours, or days after an interview. This class was designed as an alternative to formal "interview and interrogation" techniques. It gives the investigator or negotiator a way to gain truth using a simple three step process. This technique can be accomplished in just minutes if properly applied. This technique has been used in the field during investigations, ranging from infractions to felony crimes with consistent success.

### *Officer-Involved Shooting - Before, During & After*

What should today's peace officers be doing for themselves and their law enforcement brothers and sisters before, during and after an officer-involved shooting? Why are so many officers nationwide being attacked with gunfire in 2011? Why have so many single incidents resulted in multiple peace officer fatalities? These concerns will be addressed, especially for peace officers who may face a violent encounter involving deadly force. Consistent with contemporary law enforcement standards, tactical strategies will be presented to enhance critical decision making skills, to achieve peak performance, to reduce agency and individual liability and to prevent the likelihood of serious bodily injury or death. This will be accomplished through a review of recent case studies with an emphasis on best practices, law enforcement infrastructure, lessons learned and insights from those who were involved. Law enforcement personnel attending this course will gain knowledge and skills to better understand the importance of developing, improving and maintaining their commitment to officer safety.

### **Brenda Nolen & Travis Doerres Firearms Day**

This 8 hour class will combine two distinct classes of firearms training: Intermediate pistol instruction on the outdoor range and Low light shooting on an indoor range set up to simulate firing in night time conditions. The class will be limited to 24 students to provide maximum student to instructor TIME. Half of the day will be spent at the Morgan Hill Range and the other half at the South Bay Regional Training Center Indoor Range. Lunch will be served at the Regional Training Center where you will have time to interact with your fellow students and your instructors. (The Wednesday evening class will be limited to 4 hours of low light shooting. (The Saturday class will be limited to the outdoor range.)

### **11550 H&S**

**Dave Wysuph**

This 11550 H&S (Under the Influence) class will prepare the officer to accurately spot persons under the influence of drugs, safely interact with them, and conduct the necessary investigation which will allow for successful prosecution. Drugs we will specifically look at during this 8 hour presentation are, heroin (and associated opiates), cocaine and methamphetamine, hallucinogens and psychedelics.

### ~~~~~ **Critical Incident Stress Management** ~~~~~

Critical Incident stress is an occupational hazard for law enforcement professionals and their loved ones. This course will address signs and reactions in the aftermath of critical incident stress, cumulative stress and occupational stress experienced by law enforcement, with specific indicators for reserve personnel. Effective tools for stress management will be outlined, as well as the importance of implementing CISM Teams in police departments, which include reserve police officers as peers. **Janet Childs is Director of the Bay Area CISM Team, and has trained law enforcement personnel on CISM for over 25 years.**



### **Drug Endangered Children**

Sgt. Gregg Crandall - Fremont Police Dept.

Drug endangered children (DEC) are those children exposed to illegal drug environments that can become hazardous to their physical, mental or emotional health. Most often these children are found in the homes of parents who abuse, manufacture or sell illegal drugs. Today, most drug endangered children are discovered or "rescued" during law enforcement actions relating to their parents or caregivers. That event may be one of the most defining moments of their lives. This class will help you to better understand your role as a law enforcement officer in coordinating the social and political systems charged with preventing, intervening, and treating these cases. The number, complexity, and difficult behavior-change challenges of these cases burden practitioners and the community. Topics covered will include Community Awareness; the need for a comprehensive and unifying strategy; appropriate and accessible treatment intervention; prevention programs (particularly targeting high risk populations); and a collaborative and coordinated efforts between disciplines that have different roles, responsibilities and perspectives.

## FOR RESERVE COORDINATORS

### **RESERVE COORDINATOR INTRODUCTION**

This class is designed to provide an overview of the reserve program to coordinators who are newly assigned or have limited experience in their positions. The subjects covered will include POST Regulations, reserve levels, reserve officer selection, entry level and in-service training requirements and reserve program management. As an introductory class it is preliminary in nature and is not intended to take the place of the POST-certified 24-hour Reserve Coordinator Class. The instructors will be members of POST staff.

### **RESERVE COORDINATOR UPDATE**

The Update Class is intended to provide experienced coordinators with a review of changes in law and regulation affecting the reserve program, pending legislation, course certification and compliance reviews. It will be interactive using breakout groups to address contemporary issues and problems and an open forum to review best practices. The instructors will be members of POST staff. Due to the format of the Update Class, prior completion of the 24 hour class or an update class is preferred, but not required.

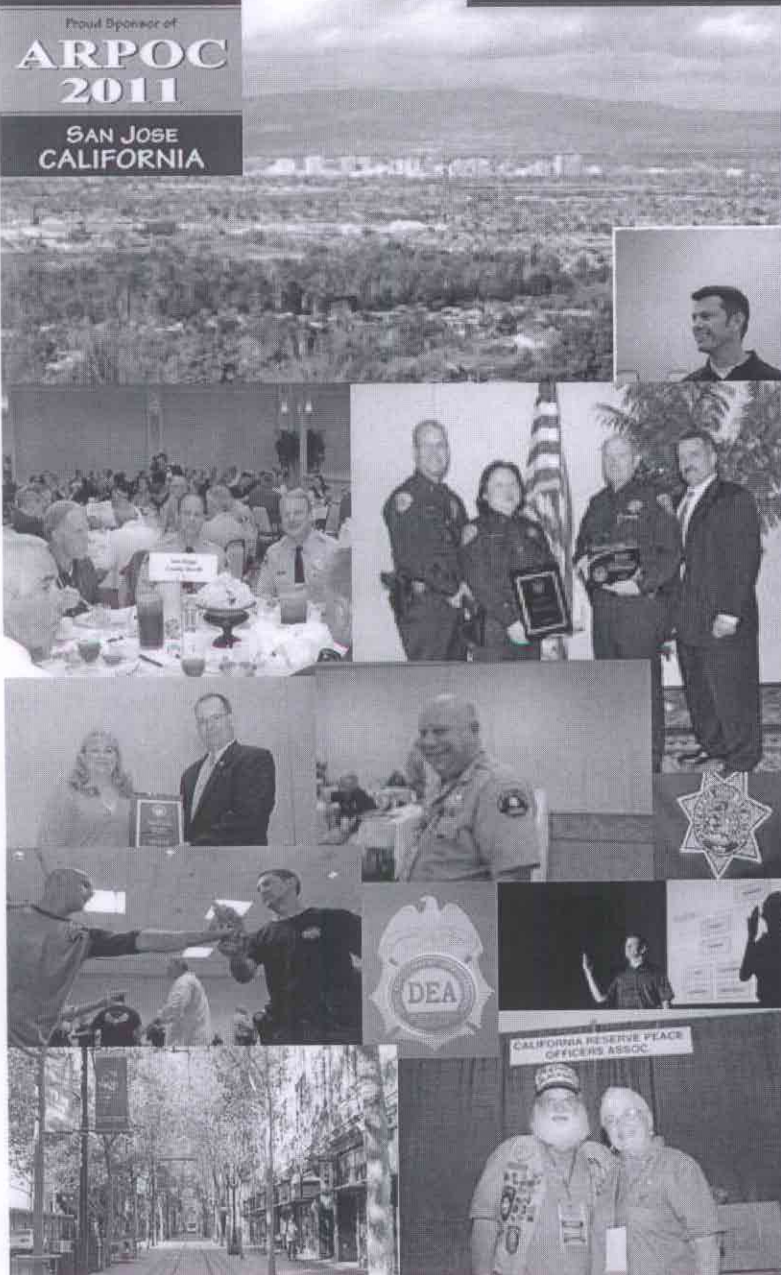

**Q - How do I receive POST credit for the classes I attend?**

*A - Simply attend the class for the complete session and sign the roster. Prior to the end of the class you will receive a distinct class sticker.*

*Place the sticker on the back of your name tag badge. When you are ready to leave ARPOC, turn in your name tag badge. ARPOC staff will validate your attendance at the class by matching the roster and the class sticker. You, your agency and POST will each receive written notification of your satisfactory completion.*



**Q - Do I need to attend the entire class to receive POST credit?**

*A - Our instructors have designed the class material to fill the entire time period. Aside from the scheduled breaks you are expected to be present at the class for entire time the class is in session. There is no credit provided for partial attendance. Please keep in mind that the majority of the instructors have donated their time to provide you with training they feel is important for your safety and knowledge. Hopefully you will thank them with your courtesy to be on time for the class and to remain for the entire session. POST Regulations require you be present for 90% of the class.*



**Q - Do I need to provide any special equipment or supplies for my class?**

*A - When you receive your Registration Confirmation indicating you have been approved to attend the class you selected, you will also receive notification of any items you will need to provide. Keep in mind if you need to bring your duty weapon and ammunition and if you are planning to fly to the conference, you will need to check with your airline to see what their regulations are. Please call the CRPOA Office at 408.371.8239 if you have any questions.*

**Q - What should I do with my weapon when I am not using it for training?**

*A - Weapons are required for some training classes. Safety is of utmost importance. Secure or conceal all weapons outside of the training classroom, unless you are in uniform..*



**Q - The Registration Process indicates I should receive a confirmation within 2 weeks from the time I mailed or faxed all the three Registration Forms and provided my payment. It has been over 2 weeks, what should I do?**

*A - Please call the ARPOC Registration Office at 408.371.8239 and leave a detailed message with your contact information. We will check on your confirmation and contact you.*

**Q - I am completely registered for the conference but I can not attend. What should I do?**

*A - The refund guidelines are outlined in Step 1 of the Registration Process. You may also ask someone to replace you at the conference. Attendee substitutions will be permitted with written authorization of the payor with no additional fees. Please call the CRPOA Office at 408.371.8239 if you have any changes or questions.*

**Q - I am registered for a class but have decided I would like to attend a different class. What should I do?**

*A - Registration simply secures you a seat in the classroom. If you make the decision prior to the deadline for registration (August 9th), please send an email to [janet@crpoa.org](mailto:janet@crpoa.org) with the details of your change. You will be notified if the change can or cannot be completed. If you decide after the deadline, you should check with Conference Registration at the conference to make sure space is available. If space is not an issue, then you simply go to the new class. Make sure you sign the roster and affix the class sticker to your badge at the conclusion of the class. If the class you wish to attend is offsite, bring your required equipment with you and go to the bus circle 30 to 45 minutes prior to start of the class. If there is space available you will be allowed on the bus by the proctor on a first-come, first-selected basis.*
